Problem statement

Objective of policy change

- Define the deadline and remove any confusion

Proposed solution

- 4. Proposal process
 - Step 1
 - A formal proposal must be submitted to the Policy SIG Chairs before the proposal deadline they set.
 - + A formal proposal must be submitted to the Policy SIG Chairs from midnight the day following the end of the OPM, to five (5) weeks before the next OPM.

Proposed solution

- Accepted proposals must be sent to the Policy SIG mailing list for discussion at least four (4) weeks before the start of the OPM.

+ Accepted proposals will be sent to the Policy SIG mailing list, by the Chairs, for discussion at least four (4) weeks before the start of the OPM.

Proposed solution

- If the four-week deadline is not met, proposals may still be submitted and presented for discussion at the OPM [...]
- + If the five weeks deadline is not met, proposals may still be submitted and presented for discussion at the OPM [...]

Proposed solution

+ If a proposal did not reach consensus, it will have to be amended before resubmission, and sent to the Policy SIG Chairs before the five weeks deadline, otherwise they will be dropped by the Chair.
